

Introduction

SOC is a behavioural safety process not simply a training course. SOC applies behavioural safety principles. It is not a formal audit, inspection or drill.

SOC is about:

- recognition and reinforcement of good practice
- intervention and correction of error-provoking conditions or unsafe acts
- personal safety - behaviour and practice
- process safety and major accident hazards

Aim

To equip delegates with the techniques to have genuine conversations about risk with the people in the workplace, allowing line managers to better understand and control risk.

To provide opportunities for delegates to practice SOC techniques in the classroom in preparation for their own application when on site.

Course contents:

- the context and rationale underpinning SOC
- the steps involved in carrying out an effective SOC
- the key skills and behaviours required by a leader in carrying out an effective SOC
- how to practice the application of SOC process, skills and behaviours in role play scenarios
- how the quality and impact of SOC can be measured

Suitable for:

Line managers and others with Safety Leadership responsibilities.

Prior Knowledge/training: Previous knowledge of behavioral safety intervention techniques would be beneficial but not essential
